Roger C. Stiles, Jr., Ret., a long standing Second Baptist Church Member.

Jasmine not only wants to instill a love of reading and learning in her students, but also emphasize self-worth, value, and confidence in themselves. As the billboard bride, she wants to portray dignity, style, grace, and yes, the sassy, fun side of being a bride. She wants to dispel the TV/media bridezilla perceptions of the world. "This is one of the single most memorable, blissful times of a bride's life," says Jasmine. It's a princess's dream coming to life." Ms. Vaughn was riding on a school bus taking her students on a field trip to the Johnson Space Center, when she first saw her face on a billboard. The students started shouting, "Ms. Vaughn. Ms. Vaughn!" She didn't even know they were up yet. "It was pretty cool," said Ms. Vaughn. In addition to the many billboards, Jasmine has also been featured in several magazines, HISD

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News, advertisements, etc. Although the billboard brides don't receive any monetary compensation, gifts or amenities, some people feel Jasmine should have had some help with her wedding. Jasmine's response is, "Although, it would have been very beneficial and much needed with the unbelievably high cost of weddings, that's my face up on the billboards, Facebook ads, and advertisement. I feel blessed to have been chosen, and especially to be the FIRST African American. This too is a Princess's dream come true."
