The S-O-S distress signal was first adopted by the German government in radio regulations in 1905, and officially became the worldwide standard in 1908.

The S-O-S distress signal consists of a continuous sequence of three-dits, three-dahs and three-dits again, all running together without any letter spacing. "S-O-S" became an easy way to remember the order of the dits and dahs. Although S-O-S doesn't stand for anything in particular, in popular usage,

S-O-S has become associated with the phrase "Save-Our-Ship."

If ever there was a need for someone to send out a distress signal, that distress signal should be aggressively coming from my people; Black people.
