Meanwhile, after the contracts for Holly and Leah were not renewed, it was alleged that Chen had been warning her co-hosts that her husband could fire them, says the Enquirer. "The Talk" premiered in October, 2010, with co-hosts, creator and executive producer Sara Gilbert, 36, Chen as the moderator, Leah Remini, 41, Holly Robinson Peete, 46, Sharon Osbourne, 58, and Marissa Jaret Winokur, 38, as a special correspondent. Winokur was asked to leave the show in January. The Enquirer's source said: "Julie didn't like Holly and Leah, and now she's made it obvious that she's not happy with Sheryl and Molly. At this point it looks like it may turn into the 'Julie, Sara and Sharon show.'" Meanwhile, the New York Post is quoting another unnamed source who says Chen, who is married to CBS President and CEO Les Moonves, is wreaking havoc on the set with cast changes, and insiders are referring to the show as "the Les Moonves show starring his annoying wife."
