

The Creston Missionary Baptist Church, under the excellent leadership of Rev. Niles Alexander, serving as it's second Pastor, celebrated it's 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. The banquet chaired by Bro. Michael Harris was recently held at Brady's Landing. Deacon Terry Garner served as the Master of the Hour. The Welcome/Occasion was delivered by Sis. Fourteen years ago, Pastor Ross and Pastor Wiley Dunn assisted with the creation of the Male Chorus Gospel Musical, "A Gathering of Black Men," a fundraiser benefitting the TSU International Championship Debate Team, coached by Dr. T. F. Freeman for over sixty three years.
