

Massachusetts State Police set up a tent near New England Patriots tight end Aaron Hernandez's North Attleborough home Monday morning. They searched nearby waters for evidence connected to the Odin Lloyd homicide investigation. At least six officers were present, with some dressed in full scuba gear and carrying metal detectors.

State Police arrived at Hernandez's home early Saturday afternoon and began searching inside and around the property. Nearly four hours later, law enforcement officials exited Hernandez's home carrying what appeared to be multiple evidence bags. The officials loaded into an unmarked vehicle that then left. The remaining authorities at the home departed shortly thereafter.

"This is way beyond what we're used to," a local police officer who was on site said. The Bristol County District Attorney's Office informed media on Saturday that the investigation is still active and ongoing. When state authorities first arrived at the site, several law enforcement officials were seen entering the home wearing gloves. Two search dogs also entered the house. State Police searched a stream near Hernandez's home for "evidence," but the Boston Globe reports that nothing was found.
